

Broken Chain

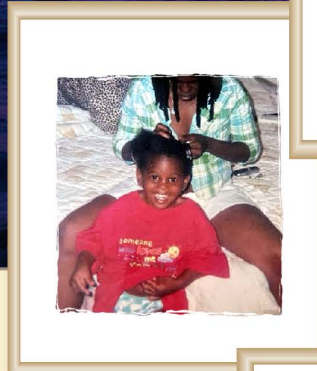
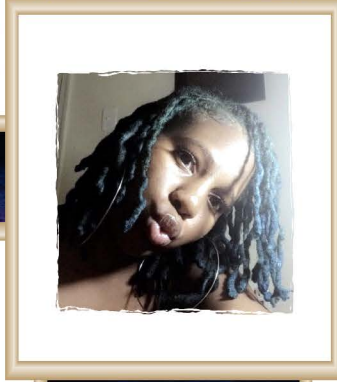

the chain will link again.



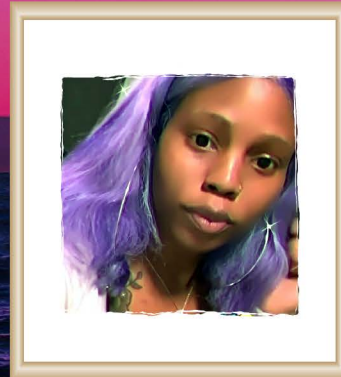
