At an early age, Pat gave her life to the Lord Jesus Christ and was a member of the Gospel Spreading Church located at 2030 Georgia Avenue, Washington, D.C.

In 1987 she rededicated her life to Christ, returned to her home church, and began her missionary work. A few years later she answered God's call as an Evangelist and preached the Word of God to many souls, fed and clothed the homeless, gave money to those who had a need, and compelled people to accept Jesus Christ. She was a prayer warrior and bold witness for the Lord Jesus Christ.

Pat last worked for MBI Health Services, LLC as a Community Support Worker (CSW) where she assisted her clients up until she became ill and could no longer work.

Pat loved the beach and looked forward to spending time with her family in Ocean City, Maryland every summer. She woke up early in the morning, sat on the beach, and read her bible while watching the sunrise and the dolphins. She loved shopping for clothes and shoes, knick-knacks and antiques, and toys for her great-grandchildren. Pat loved to cook candied yams, turkey tails, great northern beans, macaroni and cheese, potato salad, and lasagna. Lastly, she loved talking on the phone and helping people, home decor, and the color **green**.
