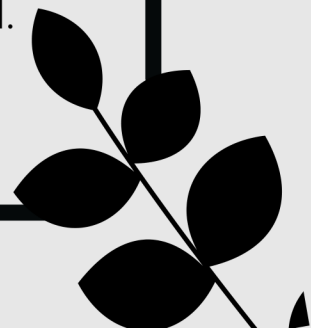

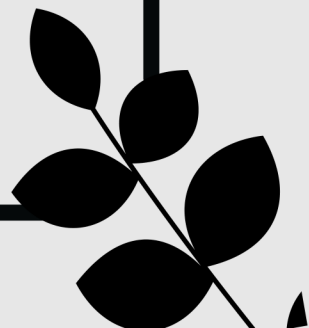

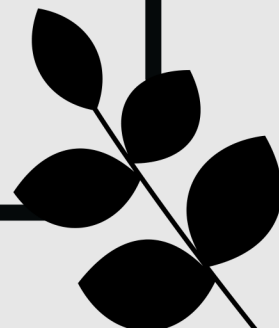
*DON'T GRIEVE FOR ME, FOR NOW I'M FREE.

BACK AND LEFT IT ALL.*

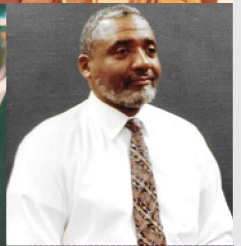
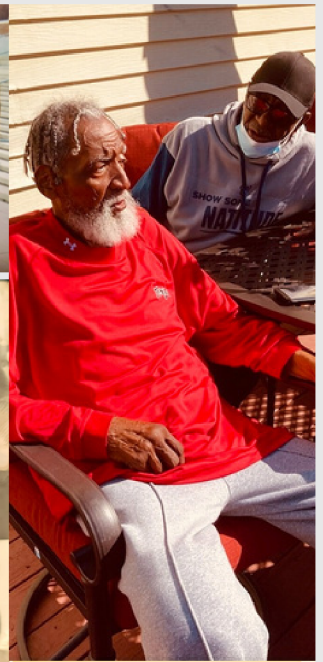
*I COULD NOT STAY ANOTHER DAY, TO LAUGH, TO LOVE, TO
