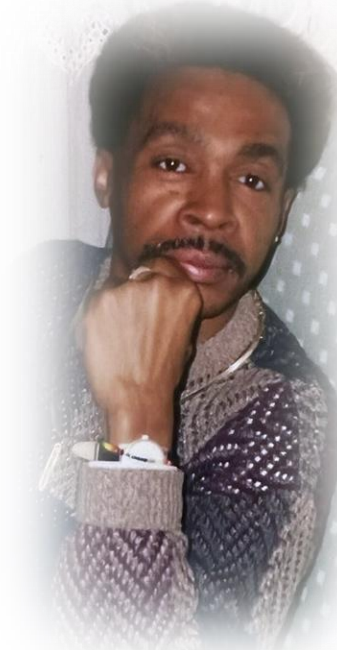

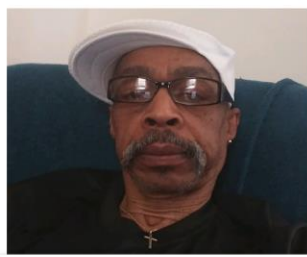
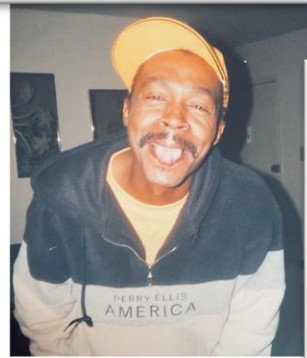

From A Daughter To A Father:

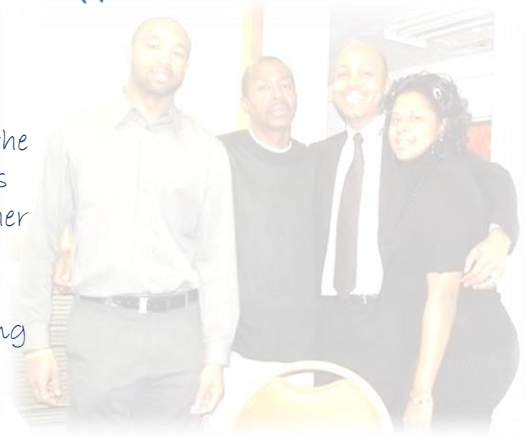

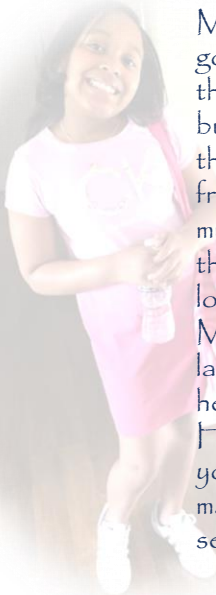
