

Sunday Amana Okoro, age 68, of Abia, Nigeria has passed away January 31st, 2023. He is survived by four children: Miracle, Esther, Hope, and Emmanuel Okoro.

Sunday grew up in the village Ohanku, which is part of Okotoko in Abia State. Later on, he migrated to the United States of America to attend college. For his undergrad year, he attended Alabama State University. Afterwards, he took master level courses towards an engineering degree at Howard University.

Sunday Okoro spent most of his life living in the Washington metropolitan area where he married and then had children. Although he worked two jobs providing for his faWmily, he never neglected instilling in his children the importance of an education. He also never failed in his duties as a father. Those who knew Sunday Okoro, knew that he was a man of great discipline, devoted Christian faith, and a man of great endurance. Despite the challenges that he faced in life, he was always thankful to God and practiced forgiveness.

Apart from his faith and discipline, Sunday Okoro knew how to find the joy and humor in simple day to day tasks. He happily hummed hymnals while he cooked his food, made his smoothies, while he cleaned up and even while he got ready. During his down time, he enjoyed sports and loved watching movies of practically almost any genre. He also was proud of his ability to solve complex mathematical problems. Apart from being devoted to his family, he would also do anything that he could to help his community in Nigeria. He was head of his village and even built a church there.
