# Gladys A. Hunter Cox



**Gladys A. Hunter Cox** was born July 5, 1937, and raised in Jacksonville North Carolina. Gladys was the youngest girl of the Hunter family. Gladys is preceded in death by her mother Annie Hunter (Henderson) her Father Eugene Hunter and her 7 siblings. Sterling Hunter, Annie Gretchen Hunter, Thelma Hunter (McAllister), Johnny Hunter, Helen Hunter (Brinson), Hattie Hunter, and Joseph Hunter.

Gladys was raised on a farm and tended to the daily goings of chores alongside her brothers and sisters. Gladys attended Georgetown High School where she graduated and worked in a dress shop downtown Jacksonville, and in 1956 she decided to get away from the Tobacco fields that her father tended and moved to Washington D.C to attend Cortez Peters Business School and shared a basement apartment with two roommates. Gladys finished her school days at 2 o'clock and worked at the 12th street YMCA, as a secretary to the director of the physical department who also was her basketball coach.

While in school Gladys also paid her way by working as a short order cook (known for making great meals) and on summer break she worked in Wildwood NJ. as a short order cook also. Gladys eventually graduated from Cortez Peters as one of their outstanding typists, her fastest was at 90 words a minute. After graduating from school, she returned to Jacksonville, North Carolina in 1960 to help take care of her mother who was severely ill and who eventually passed away during her return home.

In 1961 Gladys returned to Washington D.C and obtained a job working for the Washington Hospital Center as a file clerk and her tenure as the supervisor of Medical Records continued until she retired due to disability on March 6, 1997.

Gladys Cox married Eugene Cox and within this union their son Vavian Eugene Cox was born on June 13, 1962. Eugene and Gladys raised Vavian in Washington D.C in various residences, until they settled in Northeast D.C. Gladys is survived by her son Vavian Cox and her granddaughter Kayla Cox and two Goddaughters Shawntise and Kelli. Gladys leaves behind many nieces, nephews, family, and friends who loved her very much.
