CELEBRATING THE LIFE OF LORRAINE JERMAN IVEY



Lorraine (Mama) Jerman Ivey was born May 1, 1937, to the late Edward and Mary (Long) Jerman in Northampton County, North Carolina. Lorraine went to her heavenly home on Tuesday, October 3, 2023, at Medstar Washington Hospital Center at the age of 86. Lorraine was one of six siblings who preceded her in death. James, Henry, Edward, Albert, and Nellie. Lorraine received her education from the Halifax County School system. She was an outstanding basketball player and school Majorette.

She met the late Edward Earl Ivey, Sr. (May 1997) playing a rival basketball game against John Armstrong Chaloner High School where he attended. Earl returned to Weldon to swoon Lorraine and they married May 17, 1957. She never remarried after the passing of Earl, for he was the love of her life.

Lorraine traveled and lived in many cities with Earl and their children during his many tours of duty which included stateside residences in Quantico, VA, Camp Lejeune, NC and Camp Pendleton, CA. Once his time of service was completed, they moved to Newark, NJ, Richmond, VA, and finally settled down in Washington, DC. Lorraine worked and retired from Potomac Electric Power Company (PEPCO) after starting out in the position of an elevator operator and advancing to the Accounts Payable Department, where she completed 27 years of service before retiring. Lorraine held various positions of work before finally doing what she loved best, working with children in a school system. She found her love and retired from Shining Stars Montessori Academy Public Charter School in Washington, DC. Lorraine made sure she attended classes and received many certifications to qualify herself to work in these positions. She worked in the classroom assisting teachers and was the overseer of 'The Café', where she maintained and managed the daily activities of providing meals to the children and staff. Lorraine was admired and loved by everyone at Shining Stars, especially her good friend/superintendent Dr. Regina Rodriguez. Lorraine has been missed and will always remain in the heart of the staff at Shining Stars.

Lorraine joined and attended Tenth Street Baptist Church, Washington, DC, for well over 50 years. She was very active in Sunday School and the Secretary for her Sunday school class. She also sang with the Eveready Gospel Chorus/Sanctuary Choir of Tenth Street Baptist Church. After the pandemic, she attended 19th Street Baptist Church until her death. Lorraine enjoyed cooking and hosting dinners and gatherings for her family, especially for her grandchildren. She was well known in her neighborhood as Ms. Ivey.

Lorraine leaves to cherish her memories, two daughters Montina (Phillip) and Jamese. The late Bishop Edward Earl Ivey, Jr (son/brother/husband/grandfather) who preceded her in death (June 2022). She leaves in her legacy seven grandchildren: Steven (Friday), James (Maricel), Greg, Joshua (Adrienne), Monique, Morgan, and Shannon (Anthony). Two honorary sisters Maggie Dorsey and Jean Washington. One honorary grandson, Tyree. Seven great-grandchildren Savannah, Gideon, Elijah, Zion, Gabriella, Sasha, and affectionately her love Toryn. One brother-in-law Glenard Ivey; one sister-in-law Mabel Jerman and one daughter-in-law Valencia Ivey. 


HER JOURNEY'S JUST BEGUN
