Michael Dale Robinson (Dale), the seventh child of the late Eugene Matthew Robinson Sr. and the late Mary Agnes Shorter Robinson, was born on January 18, 1954, at Prince George's Hospital in Cheverly, Maryland. He departed this life Sunday, February 4, 2024, at Maryland University Hospital in Baltimore.

You have only gone on ahead of me, Not just left me behind. Although I can't be with you right now, Your memories live on in my heart and mind.


The day will come when we'll meet again On Heaven's distant shore, And the two of us will walk hand in hand Together forever more.
